

*Dr. Amy Bromley completed her medical training at Memorial University of Newfoundland in 2007, followed by Anatomical Pathology Residency at the University of Calgary. Upon completion in 2012, Dr. Bromley became the Lead for the Adult Medical Autopsy service at the Foothills Medical Centre, which provides non-forensic adult autopsy services to Southern Alberta. Her work involves quality assurance, novel diagnoses, systems improvement, and answering the questions that remain when a patient dies. She was a member of the Care After Death project for Acute Care Sites in Calgary from 2012-2015, helping redefine the navigation of a patient's journey after they die, and has been involved in educating clinicians and allied health professionals in Care After Death since then.*

*Dr. Bromley is also a medical educator. She developed the Pathologists' Assistant program at the University of Calgary in 2015, the second NAACLS accredited PA program in Canada. She was the co-program director for Anatomical Pathology residency training program from 2015-2018, and then took on the lead of Competence By Design until 2023. She held the position of Director of Education for the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at the University of Calgary, from 2022 until 2024, during which time she developed the Adult Medical Autopsy Fellowship Program. After many years teaching at the medical school, and being involved in undergraduate medical education curricular design, she was named the Associate Dean, Undergraduate Medical Education at the University of Calgary in January 2024. Dr. Bromley is also furthering her own education, embarking on a Masters in Precision Health at the University of Calgary with a specialization in Health Professions Education Leadership.*
