
### ASSESSMENT OF SEVERE HYPERTENSION

- 2. Is there evidence of damage to vessels or end-organs that is due to or has been worsened by the BP?


AMI Acute Pulmonary Edema


Stroke Hypertensive Encephalopathy


Catecholamine Excess HTN with Uncontrolled Bleed




### AUTOREGULATION OF CEREBRAL BLOOD FLOW

### **MESSAGE**

Hyperperfusion injury can occur in brain and other organs at a normal BP

In normotensive PRES, BP must be taken down to 'normal'

A normal MRI does <u>not</u> exclude PRES
